

This is the moment when I close my eyes and there is a movie playing right in front of me and my task is to find the right musical accompaniment. I really hope, this doesn't work only in my imagination," he For David music is the main topic of what his life is all about. "Right behind my wife and my three kids of course. Attending a seven-to-five-day job, there is not much time for other great hobbies and activities. There is the family, which needs you most of the time. Then there is a house, where you always have to do or to repair something. It's like a merry-go-round: if you finish on that side, you can start on the other side right from the beginning. Besides 'The inner me' I am playing in other bands and projects too: my second main project is 'Das schwarze Herz von Österreich' (what means the black heart of Austria in to your music without visual support - actually it's a shame ... And in combination with its awesome, jaw dropping cover artwork it hit me like a hammer. Needless to say that from this day on heavy metal was the law. My cousin was a big influence in my musical career. He also never had blinders genre wise so I also got in touch with all kinds of rock and pop music," he expresses. Daniel personally listened to many different genres of music. £I draw my Inspiration from artists that are openminded and not stuck in their style. If Daniel does not make music or even listen to music from his evergrowing collection of vinyl and CDs, then he likes to watch movies, TV series and sports entertainment, especially wrestling. "I also play games on my consoles and collect toys related to my childhood, especially figures and playsets from the brand 'Masters of the Universe' by toy company Mattel." Guitarist Reinhard 'Kotza' Mueller's first encounter with music was in his childhood when he learned to play the recorder. However, that didn't last long and so he started playing classical guitar. "I got the initial spark for rock music when I discovered my older brother's records and became aware of bands like Black Sabbath and Deep Purple," he points out. After he got his first electric guitar as a Christmas present, he started playing along with his brother's records. 'Iron Man', 'Paranoid', 'Whole Lotta Love' and all those great songs with the big guitar riffs. And then I discovered UFO with Michael Schenker. His way and art of playing the guitar influenced me the most and laid the foundation for my future playing. For days I tried to listen to and replay the songs from the LP. And then came Gary Moore, George Lynch, Yngwie and all the other guitar heroes. And not to forget - Iron Maiden - The number of the beast. The twin guitars still influence me today. Today I think more outside the box and am also enthusiastic about quitarists like Joe Bonamassa, Steve Morse, David Gilmour, and many others," he enthuses. As Kotza mentioned before, his main influence are

definitely Michael

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Schenker. "Not only during his time with UFO, but he inspired me with his first solo albums, which are still among my favourites today. The songs, which are mostly based on an ingenious guitar riff combined with melodic and virtuosic solos, are still a huge inspiration. And this is also how the songs for our new album were created: I first compose an instrumental version of the song based on a main guitar riff. The lyrical concept - for which singer David is solely responsible - often flows into the songs and we try to implement the content musically. Since there are also two ballads on this album, this time we worked with real strings, a background singer, and a piano player for the first time, which gave the songs additional support and even greater intensity," he expresses. Since Kotza works full-time as a dispatcher for the Austrian railway, he finds that music is the best hobby you can have. "I like many different musical styles and therefore play all kinds of music in my free time with other musicians in various bands and groups. From Gipsy Jazz to Acoustic Blues and I'm even a banjo player in a Dixieland band. Everything that makes fun. Of course, I am not only an active musician but also a huge music fan who still buys CDs and DVDs and loves going to concerts. The band's new album 'Rosabelle Believe' tells the life story of the greatest escape artist and magician of the twentieth century, Harry Houdini, from the time of his leaving Hungary for the land of unlimited opportunities until his mysterious death on Halloween of 1926. "We tried to translate his exciting life, his outstanding magic tricks and also his love for his wife Bess into music. The final title song represents the 'code word' with which the magician wanted to connect with his Bess from the afterlife: 'Rosabelle Believe'. 'Rosie, sweet Rosabel' was their favourite song and was always played by Bess on the piano. The song is featured as an outro on the CD and is sung by David's daughter Anika," explains Kotza.



The band's first album 'A New Horizon' was released in 2015 and was a project that the band actually recorded just for fun and didn't produce much. "We were therefore hugely surprised at the great response to this CD. On the first album the drums came from the computer and on the new album - 'Rosabelle Believe' - we worked with drummer Rainer Lidauer. Rainer was also responsible for the drum recordings that he made in his studio. On the current album the arrangements are a little more playful and the sound is much more transparent than on the

The highlight of the album for Kotza is the implementation of David's lyrical concept, namely a continuous story that is reflected in the arrangements of the songs. "When David suggested the text concept to us, I was a bit sceptical at first because I thought it would be very difficult to implement. But the longer we worked on it, the more we became excited about the topic and I think we managed it quite well. We tried to cover everything in as many varieties as possible.
